Today's Theme: "The Radiant Glory Of God"

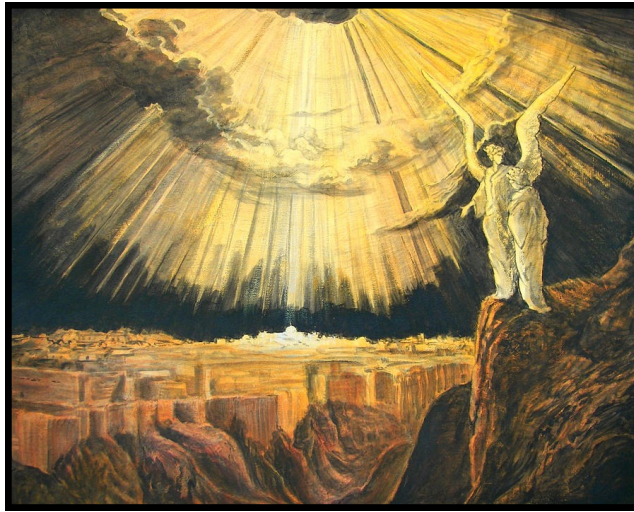
The Holy Spirit is the radiant glory of God that enlightens the Church and guides it on its way through the world in all its decisions.

Dear Parishioners,

Tradition

Change is a constant factor of our lives now. Of course, we've always lived with change, it's just that now it seems to be unabated, unpredictable, and unrestrained. Attempts to 'slow' down societal change and even to control the directions and dimensions of change, are mostly doomed to failure. We can't hold it back, let alone prevent it. In a world that can often be uncertain, ironically one certainty is that things will change.

As situations around us change – be they experienced at a personal, professional, familial, or societal level, we usually need to change our attitude and ultimately our responses if we are to live with the 'new' in a harmonious and authentic way. But how to go about doing this? How does one dialogue with 'change' and its many manifestations in our personal, family, societal and church life? Indeed 'dialogue' might be a key word here, for we usually find our way into living authentically with new patterns of life by reflection, discernment, and openness – all key elements in any successful dialogue. Another way to express this is to interact with any 'new' or changed' situation by keeping an open mind, an open heart and an open will.

If we do not cultivate our mental and reasoning capacity so that we can have an *open mind*, we will never hear what the new is offering to us, or never understand the issues or causes it seeks to address. But mere understanding is not enough. We need an *open heart* since some situations and new propositions require us to approach them with kindness, compassion, and tolerance. Even then, if we do nothing by way of responding, or at least tolerating new situations we won't bridge any gaps – we need also to have an *open will* (so that we can act).

Dialoguing with the new also requires of us, wisdom. Here we meet the power and capacity of tradition. Fundamental truths that have guided Christians across the centuries are available to us and can assist us on any journey into the future.

Tradition is not to be confused with mere conservatism or legalism. Tradition, according to the understanding of the Catholic Church is a dynamic, ongoing reality – it is a medium for the transmission of our apostolic faith as guided by the Holy Spirit. Tradition, alongside our Scriptures, is one means by which apostolic teaching is passed on through the ages in a vital and living way. Tradition often must be re-stated and redefined to meet new worlds, but it is a source of the ongoing revelation of God as known through the wisdom and practice of our community.

Jesus too leaned upon, and learnt from, the gifts of his faith and community traditions. Jesus called upon the wisdom of revelation and the scriptures given to his people to withstand temptations, constant harassment and ultimately persecution, arrest, and unjust execution. We learn from his example, but our path is also guided by the foundational gifts of the Christian Scriptures and Tradition.
