Feast of St Raphael

St. Raphael the Archangel is frequently associated with **healing**, but in art forms is also often depicted with a staff in hand – reflecting the tradition that Raphael has been associated with **guarding pilgrims on their journeys**. Perhaps the two themes can be combined since we celebrate the Feast of St Raphael this weekend.

It seems possible to speak of healing itself as a 'journey' in that healing often involves an inner movement to restore or repair one's inner life subject as it is to our thoughts, emotions, and longings. The task of bringing such deep and powerful aspects of our person into alignment with our faith and spiritual life can call us to venture into new spaces and adopt new attitudes and disciplines – all of which might be seen as an 'inner journey'.

At the same time, a desire to heal or to be healed may also apply to our external world at those times we see that to create or restore peace or harmony. To do this we need to take steps to repair relationships or to correct patterns of behavior. This too can call us to move to a new stance or into unfamiliar territory in life.

Mending, restoring and remedying relationships or situations often requires more than words; real healing can begin in a change of language, but this must lead us onwards to adopt new attitudes so that we can form new patterns of behavior. All of this is a journey. We may not always reach the destination we seek, but the important thing is to be on the journey trying and practicing so that we stay true to our desired destination.

Since the time of the Second Vatican Council, we are accustomed to speaking of the Church as a 'pilgrim people' on a 'journey'. This is ever so true. We move forward today to address and meet the world as it rapidly evolves, to encourage what builds up the common good and to challenge those forces which act against life. We seek to play our part in caring for the environment, the displaced and the voiceless. At the same time the Church itself is always in need of reform and today we are strongly focused on correcting past mistakes and poor practices.

Let us seek God's help in every effort today to be agents of healing in our world. St. Raphael pray for us.
