Dear Parishioners,

We have just recently passed the sixtieth anniversary of the opening of the **Second Vatican Council** by Pope John XXIII. That day, 11 October 1962, is now Saint John XXIII's feast day and it seems timely to recall his message to the world on that day:

"Now the Bride of Christ [the Church] wishes to use up the medicine of mercy rather than taking up the arms of severity... The Catholic Church, as she holds high the torch of Catholic truth at this Ecumenical Council, wants to show herself a loving mother to all, patient, kind, moved by compassion and goodness". Pope John went on to remind the Council to have the mind of Christ – that is, *"in essentials unity, in non-essentials liberty, and in all things charity."*

It seems good then to review our own parish Vision Statement and Mission Statement in light of the vision that Pope John XXIII held, and wanted the Church to grow into. Our Parish Vision is to be *"an inclusive Catholic Community, connecting people to God and to one another."*

Lived out in our Parish Mission, which is to be *"Guided by the Gospel, our Catholic tradition and inspired by the Spirituality of the Passionists we are a welcoming, diverse community with a strong focus on equality for all. We seek God through our gathering to celebrate the Eucharist and to share in liturgies which nurture our stewardship, commitment to social justice and providing spiritual nourishment and hospitality."*

It seems to me that our own Vision statement and Mission statement are in keeping with the dream that Saint John XXIII had in 1962. When our own Parish Pastoral Council worked to create our statements, we did not go back to the Vatican II documents to find our inspiration, rather our thoughts and sharing – that led to our Vision and Mission statements - flowed from the lived experience of the PPC members who have all been born into and lived within the Church that has grown from the Council's message to the world.

The Council ended in 1965, and sadly Pope John XXIII did not live to see the results of his initiative. In 1963, on his deathbed, Pope John said: *"It is not that the gospel has changed; it is that we have begun to understand it better... and know that the moment has come to discern the signs of the times, to seize the opportunity and to look far ahead."* His final vision is a true today as it was in the 1960's.

Perhaps in 1965, no one would have predicted the dramatic changes the Church has lived through over these sixty years, and how internal and external factors have led to many older patterns of Church life changing; nor could the Vatican Council members have foreseen the evolution of new movements and expressions of faith. Patterns of life, devotions and practices have changed, but the deeper values underpinning them prevail, and I am sure that Saint John XXIII would be happy to see that we are adhering closely to the core values he outlined in his opening address.

CHILD SAFE ENVIRONMENTS BRIEFING FOR VOLUNTEERS

As you may be aware, all volunteers in our Archdiocese are mandated notifiers under the South Australian Child Protection Legislation. To ensure we hear the voices of children and have the necessary skills to identify and respond appropriately, we invite any volunteers who have not yet participated in Child Safe Environments training or an equivalent course to attend a 90 minute Volunteer Briefing session facilitated by the Archdiocesan Child Protection Unit.

The next volunteer briefing sessions will be:

- ◆ **Saturday 12th November at Brooklyn Park/Richmond Parish** (St John Bosco Parish Hall) from 10:30am – 12:00pm.
- ◆ **Wednesday 30th November at Glenelg Parish** (the parish is putting on a light morning tea after the session) from 10:00am – 11:30am
- ◆ **Thursday 8th December at the Cathedral Hall** (39 Wakefield St) from 6:30pm – 8:00pm – open to volunteers from all parishes who need to attend a volunteer briefing session, but couldn't attend in their own parish.

If you have attended a Child Safe Environments or RRHAN training within the past 3 years you do not need to attend a Volunteer Briefing. Please note: the content of the session is not suitable for children and young people (under 18 years old) to attend so please make alternative care arrangements for your children before attending a Volunteer Briefing.
