PARISH OVERSEAS PILGRIMAGE APRIL 7TH – APRIL 24TH 2024

Our Pilgrimage is just under one year away, and our itinerary plans are now finalised. Please consider this wonderful opportunity to join with other parishioners over this three-week journey. Our pilgrimage will incorporate visits to sites that are of significance in the universal Church, opportunities for prayer and Eucharist together, ample free time, and opportunities to visit Passionist places of significance. We begin our Pilgrimage in the Holy Land and conclude in the city of Paris.

During these twenty-one days together we will visit places where Jesus lived and ministered such as Cana, the Mount of the Beatitudes, the Sea of Galilee, the River Jordan, Bethlehem, Jerusalem, and the Passionist Retreat in Bethany, and many more. From the Holy Land, we will depart for Rome and have the opportunity to visit St. Peter's, Saints John & Paul's (the home of the Passionist Congregation), the seven Pilgrimage Basilicas of Rome, and the city of Pompeii amongst other sites. From Rome, we will journey north to Florence, Lucerne, Switzerland, and on to Paris, France (where we will visit the Passionist Church of St Joseph's – an English-speaking ministry to all of France).

Parishioners can also add on days prior to, or after, the official pilgrimage dates. A feature of our pilgrimage is that it will be conducted in three distinct sections, and participants may choose to do individual sectors rather than the entire programme. WHY DO WE CELEBRATE TRINITY SUNDAY?

God is love. That is the simple, profound truth at the heart of Trinity Sunday. Consider a husband and wife who have loved each other for many years. They approach life with a sense of 'we' rather than 'I'. Paradoxically, instead of losing a sense of self-identity, each spouse discovers a greater sense of uniqueness through the love of the other.

This analogy helps us to glimpse the unity of the three persons of the Trinity. God is persons in a relationship of perfect unity; unique persons, but completely one.

In a society full of isolated individuals crying out 'Who am I?' To whom do I belong? Through relationships of love, we discover God.

Saturday 10am (English); Vigil Mass 6pm

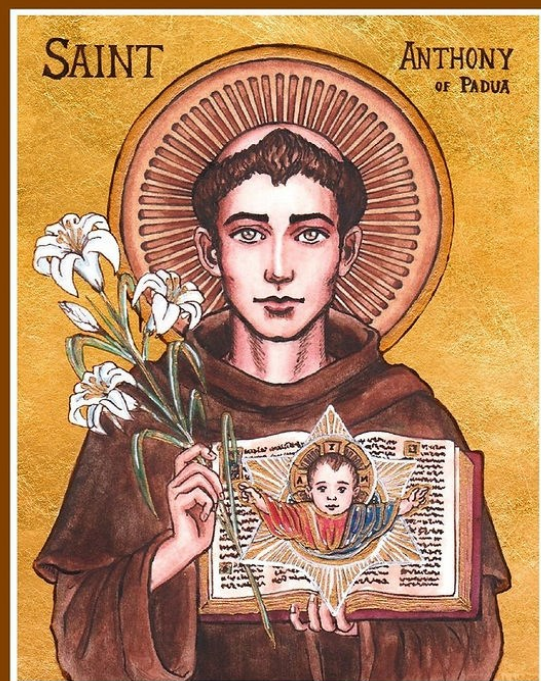

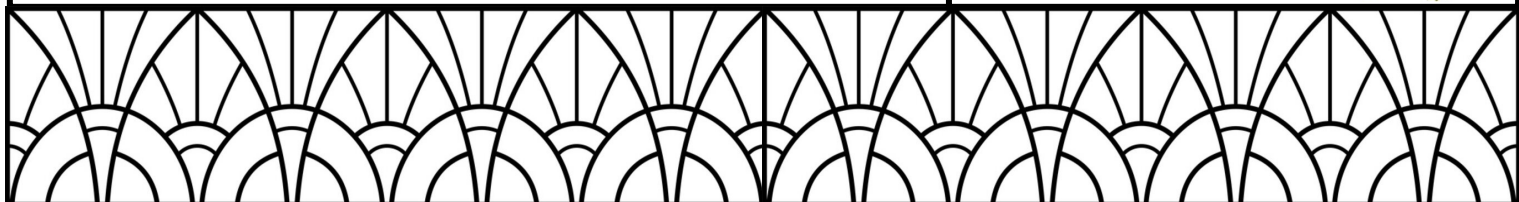
MUSIC OF HOPE

CHILD SAFE ENVIRONMENTS

Did you know that the United Nations Convention has established 42 rights for children and young people and we as adults have a responsibility to protect these rights? These rights are known as articles, this is article number 19 and 37;

Children have the right not to be hurt or mistreated in any way, or be punished in cruel or harmful ways.

We all want the best for our children and want to teach them right from wrong so they grow into caring and happy adults. It is important however for adults to practise compassion and care as well as discipline, remembering that children are vulnerable and are harmed by cruel treatment. Children have the right to safety from violence of any kind as do adults. Let us teach and guide our children gently and with love, just as God teaches and guides us with compassion, care and forgiveness.
