

FR TOM WRITES...

Feast of Paul of the Cross • Swept up into the Sea of Love

In the glorious chapel where, beneath the altar, the body St Paul of the Cross can be viewed. Above the altar, a striking painting shows Christ on the cross, one arm free, lifting St Paul of the Cross to his breast, drawing him close to his wounds.

Well, a lot of you would know the reflection "Footprints." Looking back on his life the pilgrim sees two sets of footprints in the sand. At the times that were the hardest, there is only one set. When asked where He was then, Jesus answers that in those hardest moments, He was carrying the pilgrim.

The painting above the altar of St Paul of the Cross is the Passionist version of that same truth. Here, Christ does not simply walk beside Paul. Jesus lifts Paul holds him close and carries him to his wounded side. It is the Passion rendered not as a burden borne by Christ, but it is Love's embrace. It is not the saint who reaches up to Christ - it is Christ who reaches down, holding Paul close and carrying him. The message is simple, in all life's shifting tides. It is Jesus who carries us.

Paul asked his followers to spend 3 hours a day before the cross, before the crucifix. The focus, that attention, often wordless. Not just because no words are enough, but because this time isn't for us to be talking to Christ on the cross. It is three hours in which Christ on His cross gazes intently into our hearts. His gaze, not our words, are the prayer of love lifting us to his side.

And pressed to his side, we realise that those wounds are not Christ or made by a spear. They are our wounds, which Jesus carries with us and for us. The Passion that afflicts him is not the past, what happened to him. Our wounds are what he suffers now. They are the meeting-place of divine and human pain, the secret of love's union.

St Paul of the Cross often spoke of this prayerful mutual attention as an entering into the Sea of the Passion that leads into the Sea of Love. To enter that sea is to be immersed in the mystery of a God whose suffering is love without limit. "There," Paul wrote, "we fish for pearls of love in the sea of the Passion of Jesus." In that ocean, sorrow and tenderness become one; the Cross is the most overwhelming experience of God's love, making our pain his own.

Our sufferings might feel very small compared to Christ's Passion - our domestic storms and private griefs, the daily fatigue, the quiet worries that keeps us awake at night. The Passion can seem immense, awesome, a vast suffering beyond our scale. Yet, St Paul would say this: every drop of our own sorrow, when offered with love, falls into that great sea. It literally becomes God's own Passion. To paraphrase a once common saying: God say to us in this prayerful, mutual gaze: When you cry, I taste the tears. Though the Lord bears the weight of the world, nothing is too small to be noticed and in his vast compassion, nothing is more precious.

So many times, when I have been with someone, to support them after a death, a diagnosis, chronic pain or distress, they so often say: 'But Father, others have it much worse than I do'. It's a generous instinct. However, suffering is not a competition. While circumstances may differ, it is not the size of the wound but the depth of sorrow that matters. Each person's cross is unique and precious to God, and in Christ's wounds every sorrow finds its place. In God's eyes, no sorrow is trivial. Love does not compare. It simply bends low, gathers, and carries.

For Paul, three hours a day before the Crucifix, wasn't meant to achieve anything more than to let Christ gaze upon us, and for us to see ourselves; in a mirror that his hands, his feet, his side, the blood and tears are in fact our own, that now he has made his own. In that gaze, prayer ceases to be effort and becomes surrender. We are drawn, lifted, held - carried into the Sea of Love.

Finally, we don't need a daily three hours. We need regular periods of focused attention, creates new pathways in our minds and hearts. Our ways of thinking, feeling responding become transformed. Gradually, our inner landscape reshapes itself. The gaze of Christ becomes the lens through which we see others, respond to suffering, and understand love.

TAA (Take Away Activity)

Find a quiet moment before a crucifix or cross. Sit not as a spectator but as one being seen. Breathe slowly and pray:


"Lord Jesus, in your wounds, see me. In my wounds, hold me."


